HIS ARTISTIC EYE IS DIFFERENT BECAUSE IT BELONGS TO AN AVID ROAD RUNNER, TO A MAN WHO TOOK DOZENS OF BIBS AND RAN THOUSANDS OF KILOMETERS.

Through his art, Vincent DOGNA elevates each and every feeling of sportsmen. To direct the viewer's eye and focus it on bodies and their non-verbal language, he takes out the sportswear and their colors. He manages to freeze and capture an instant, a defining moment experienced by runners and gives it an attribute of timelessness.

The blue line is the ideal path followed by marathon runners to track the exact distance of 42KM95. This line, which is drawn on the ground of most major marathons, was present in this artist's first painting. To this day, it still embodies the guiding thread of his pictorial work, his muse, one of his major hallmarks


BLUE(/BLEUE) Series





WENZHOU Series


In this series of paintings, Vincent DOGNA continues his work on the human body. He incorporates Wenzhou paper onto the canvas to give it some relief, creating a new frame. The extreme thinness of this paper built from the bark of the mulberry tree allows him to bring new dynamics to his work. He accentuates the strength of the anatomy, the power of matter, of flesh and of their vibrations.



ASPHALT Series

In this series of paintings, Vincent DOGNA reinforces his visual identity. He integrates in a literal way some graphic elements matching urban signage systems (such as pedestrian crossings) to body representations of the runners' bodies. The painter unfolds all his techniques from his artistic universe made of painting, graphic design and illustrations. He performs the fusion of the marathon runner and of asphalt. Is this the body which blends into the city or is it the city which engulfs the bodies, it's up to you to imagine it.

42KM195 Series

Along with the blue line, the mythic distance of the marathon, 42KM195, is one of Vincent DOGNA's most important signatures. This design is adapted from the sculpture he created for his solo exhibition at the Stade de France. Over time, this pattern which was born from a volume takes up more and more space in his work. It has become an iconic symbol for numerous marathoners. Some of them actually didn't hesitate and chose to wear it as a tattoo.

In the "SPLASH" collection, the artist pursues his work by adding the bodies of the marathoners to the specific pattern of 42KM195. Overlap those paintings, and you'll be able to picture a runner in action. The assembly consisting of men and women generate the dynamic representation of what the author calls: "his universal stride".

Vincent DOGNA

Born in Longwy in 1964 – lives and works in Paris in the 12th district.

Art and sport.

After an atypical learning journey, consisting of studying Apply Arts in Paris and Hainaut course of crafts in Belgium, his professional path leads him to hone his artistic sense first as a graphic designer, then as an artistic director in an advertising agency. There he dedicates himself exclusively to his job at the expense of painting.

In 1992, he starts running to quit smoking. Amateur athlete, he attends many races in France and abroad. In 2006, he gets injured, and is unable to run for 6 months. He grabs his old brushes and paints the one thing he misses the most: "the blue line", this ideal line which leads every marathoner during the 42km195 of the marathon.

Vincent translates on the canvas each and every feeling and emotion that running grants. In 2009, he shows his paintings to the world, and they quickly resonate within runners. During his first exhibit at the French Ministry of Youth and Sports, his first painting "blue line" is selected for the Salon of French Artists in the Grand Palais. His peculiar artistic work interests the race organizing committees. He starts to be a regular on «Running expos» and finds his audience in France.

In 2010 he decides to leave his agency to dedicate himself to painting. Even though his style is quite figurative, he isn't confined in a single style, only the subject drives him in his artistic approach. Life is a prism of many facets. Graphic design, painting and running shine through it every day. Today his artworks begin to cross boundaries because they represent a passion shared by millions of people.
